Traffic Safety



Traffic outside school is busy, especially around 2.50pm and on wet days. Please show consideration to others and remember to keep clear of the areas that the children use. We encourage parking 'away' from the school and walking into the Wilson street entrance. Students should avoid the Bridge Street entrance due to the traffic volume increasing the chance of danger. **Please slow right down when entering the school car park. Do not enter school grounds between 8.00am & 4.30pm.**

Scooters & Bikes at School

We are happy that our children use these methods to get to school. Once they reach the school grounds we expect them to push their wheels to the bike stands in order to avoid accidents and mishaps. If your child is unable to adhere to these guidelines we may have to ask them to discontinue bringing their bikes or scooters to school. Students must place their wheels in the stands as soon as they arrive. We discourage 'other' types of wheels as this can create unnecessary issues. Our bike track is for everyone's enjoyment. Helmets must be worn at all times.



Road Patrollers



A staff member and road patrollers are on duty from 8.30 – 8.45am and 2.50 – 3.05pm at the main crossings. Please use the patrolled crossings. Please ensure that your child crosses the main road when the crossing is patrolled. As a driver, we ask that you observe both the patrollers and the 'No Parking' areas. The car park is best avoided at peak times.

Bus Transport

Students who live on Ohakea Base or in the Parewanui area, are currently permitted to use the MOE provided bus service which has an extension to Bulls School. Parents are responsible for letting the school office know whether or not their child is using this service on any given day. A bus list is kept in the office and students are checked off and supervised by the duty teacher until the bus arrives to collect them shortly after 3pm each afternoon. MOE guidelines regarding eligibility, safety and behaviour are all enforceable and a student may be refused the service if breaches to these guidelines occur. A full list of the guidelines is available at school for your perusal.



Uniform Code

All students wear the Bulls School polo shirt, polar fleece and the sport & Cultural top, and the logoed red bucket hat available from Academy Apparel in Palmerston North. Their 'bottom' is non regulation other than a colour restriction to plain black (no writing, logos, stripes or other colours). Shoes need to be suitable for school wear.

Please name ALL clothing and shoes.

In Terms 1 and 4 of each year, red Bulls School bucket hats must be worn when outdoors. We recommend student hats stay at school in their classroom as not having a hat means the child has restricted play areas (deck areas with shade). We also recommend sunblocking your child before school. Top up Sunblock is available from sunscreen stations around the school.

Restorative Process is a framework that supports our school in creating a culture where positive behaviour and learning thrive. The focus is on 'restoration of relationships' and the creation of a 'culture of care' to develop 'responsible citizens'. The fundamental premise is that people are happier, more co-operative and productive and more likely to make changes when those in authority do things *with* them, rather than *to* them.

Absences

Phone 322 1184 and select 1 for absences or the App are the best way to notify us of a child's absence.

Parents are asked to contact us before 8.50am if their child is going to be absent or late.

The electronic roll is marked at 9am & 1.45pm

Enrolment Procedures

Parents may complete enrolments for children from their 4th Birthday, but they must be attending school by the age of 6. The admission procedure requires the child's Birth Certificate and Immunisation Certificate to be copied by the office. The two signed Consent Forms and the Digital Citizenship Agreement form, must also be returned.

Lollies & Carbonated Drinks

Lollies and carbonated drinks are not allowed at school. We prefer water bottles to be used in class.

Unclaimed Property

The property bin is located outside the Senior Hub and should be checked regularly. We are constantly surprised by the amount of unclaimed, un-named clothing, which we dispose of or recycle at the end of each term.

Swimming

We are fortunate enough to have a school pool. In Term 1 we teach our junior & middle hub children to swim here.

In Term 4 we run a swimming programme in conjunction with Marton Swim School at the Marton Pool for two weeks for our Seniors.

Lunch in School

The Ministry provide free healthy lunches daily, you will need to provide morning tea and a water bottle for your child. Please let the office know of any dietary requirements, alternatively you can opt out of the Lunch Scheme and provide your own healthy lunch.

Stationery

The Board of Trustees made a decision to provide all students with their stationery requirements for the year.

Kapa Haka

We have an excellent Kapa Haka instructor. Kapa Haka is an integral part of our school.

Early Pick Ups If Necessary

If you are collecting your child during school hours please report to the office to sign out.

Book Club

The school operates the Scholastic Book Club. This gives the children an opportunity to purchase children's books of good quality at competitive prices and also the school gains 'points' which they use to get books for the Library.

Toys & Valuables

The school accepts no responsibility for valuable items such as ipods, cell phones, special toys etc brought from home to school by pupils. Our cybersafety policy allows Year 7 & 8's to have a cell phone at school. We prefer it if children do not bring toys to school on a regular basis. It causes heartache if toys and valuables are lost or broken. Individual teachers will let you know if they have a special day for children to bring things from home for sharing.

Office Hours

The office is staffed between 8.15am to 3.00pm daily. Feel free to contact the school at any time. The phone will not always be manned so organising after school pick-ups should be done before school.

Once you have downloaded the Skool Loop App, via either your Google Play or App store, please follow the below instructions to select your school -

- Open the Skool Loop App - you will land on a welcome page.
- Click the 'Select your schools' this will bring you to a menu you can either search your school or follow the country/region prompts.
- Once you reach your school, select it with the tick on the righthand side.
- Tap the 'select schools' button in the top right corner.
- Tap the big orange choose button. This will load your school and bring you to the settings page.

Uniform Code

- * All students wear the Bulls School polo shirt, polar fleece, sports and cultural tee shirt and red bucket hat, available from Academy Apparel Palmerston North. Their 'bottom' is non regulation other than a colour restriction to plain black (no white strip or other logos)
- * Shoes need to be suitable footwear for school.
- * Please name all clothing and shoes. Sweatshirts are best named with permanent marker under the hem or in the collar.
- * In Terms 1 and 4 of each year, Bulls School bucket sunhats MUST be worn when outdoors.
- * If hair is long, we request it is tied back for safety, hygiene and practical purposes. Hair styles and colours should be as natural as possible and avoid extreme 'trends' which may be seen as threatening.
- * Jewellery should be kept to a minimum and not pose any health or safety dangers.
- * When students are representing our school at events, they will be issued with a uniform – suited to the type of event they are participating in. Prompt cleaning and returning of these is appreciated.
